The Post-Graduate Year One (PGY-1) Pharmacy Residency Program at the Washington DC Veterans Affairs Medical Center is designed for residents interested in practicing in a number of areas, including ambulatory care and acute inpatient care. The residency program is accredited by the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP) and is one year in length, approximately beginning on July 1st.
